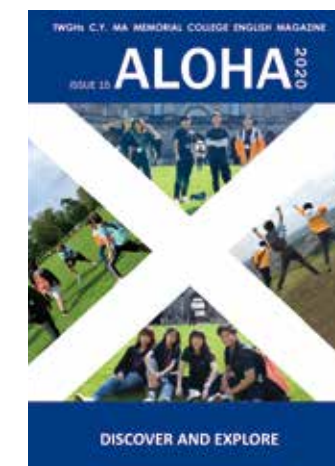

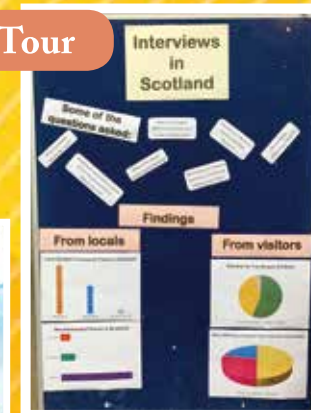

It is said that in the 4th Century BC, mountain people in Southeast Asia wrapped fermented fish in sour rice. The protein was contained in the fish. Then this method spread into China and later Japan. The Japanese named it sushi. The most famous food in Japan is sushi.

The modern trend of sushi in Japan was begun by Hanaya Yohei in the mid 1800s. He put fish onto rice balls and squeezed them together. In the past, the sushi had been fermented for a long time. Now, it was fresher and faster to make. It became a cheap snack to eat with the hands while watching a theatre performance. Around this time, the sushi all tasted too similar. Therefore, masters in Japan developed sushi to have different textures, tastes and presentation. So, sushi became popular. People began to fall in love with its taste.

Sushi began to become more of a staple food and not just a snack. Its weight increased. Wasabi was used to increase the flavour. Real wasabi comes from wasabi japonica plants in Japan, not horseradish which is often used. The powerful burn of the wasabi comes from natural antimicrobial chemicals in the plant. It is the perfect addition for killing microbes and parasites in raw seafood. But its price has become expensive.

The trend of eating sushi seems to be still popular and the styles in which it is eaten and served will continue to increase. After sushi became so popular in Japan, it has become a trend all over the world.

INTERESTING SUSHI FACTS

1. Originally, Sushi Rice Was Never Eaten

The sour rice wrapped around aged fish fermented with the fish, but then it was thrown away. The rice helped to preserve the fish, give it flavour and protect it from flies. Today, the vinegary rice used for sushi is considered as important as the fish itself.

2. Sushi Is Supposed To Be Eaten With The Hands

The origins of sushi as a simple fast food means that sushi should be eaten with your fingers. Chopsticks are used for eating sashimi – raw slices of fish without rice.

3. Nori Was A Bit Disgusting

Nori is the seaweed used to wrap some sushi. It was once scraped off wooden pier legs and even the underside of boats. The slimy mess was then pressed into sheets and dried in the sun. Today, nori is grown and farmed.

He is a boy with a long nose. He doesn't wear glasses but his eyes glow like diamonds. He always tells jokes to make us laugh every day. We all like to play with him.

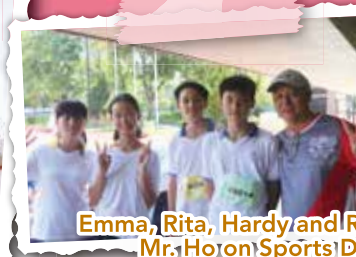
As a member of the school's Flag Raising Team, he goes to the training session with me every Monday. We are always in the same group.

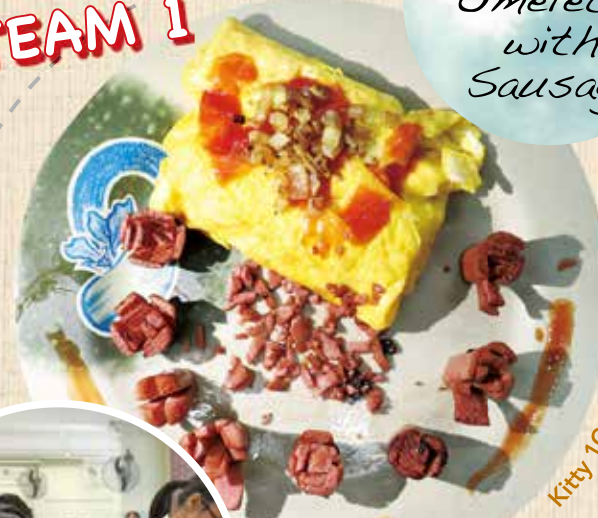

The judging and tasting panel enjoyed all of the dishes and liked the variety. The young students were able to taste each other's culinary creations and there was plenty to go around. The event was a rewarding contest and each team was proud of what they achieved in a short amount of time. Let's try more cooking at lunch-times!

Christmas Cooking – Bread and Butter Pudding

This year's food at the C.Y. Ma Christmas celebration on LAC Day in the covered playground was a traditional English favourite, Bread and Butter Pudding.

Class 3C made the bread and butter pudding in the school kitchen the previous afternoon. It was finished in the oven just before lunch-time, so it could be served piping hot.

How to Make Perfect Bread and Butter Pudding - Use sliced white bread which is stale with the crusts cut off. Butter the bread on one side and cut each slice into 4 neat triangle. Arrange the bread in a baking dish and add some sultanas and cinnamon for flavour. Make a simple custard by heating equal amounts of milk and cream (about 1.8 litres total). Add vanilla extract to the milk and cream. Whisk 10 eggs with some caster sugar to taste until pale and then add to the milk and cream. Finally, pour the custard over the bread and sprinkle cinnamon and brown sugar over the top. Leave to stand for a while and then bake at 180C for 30 minutes.

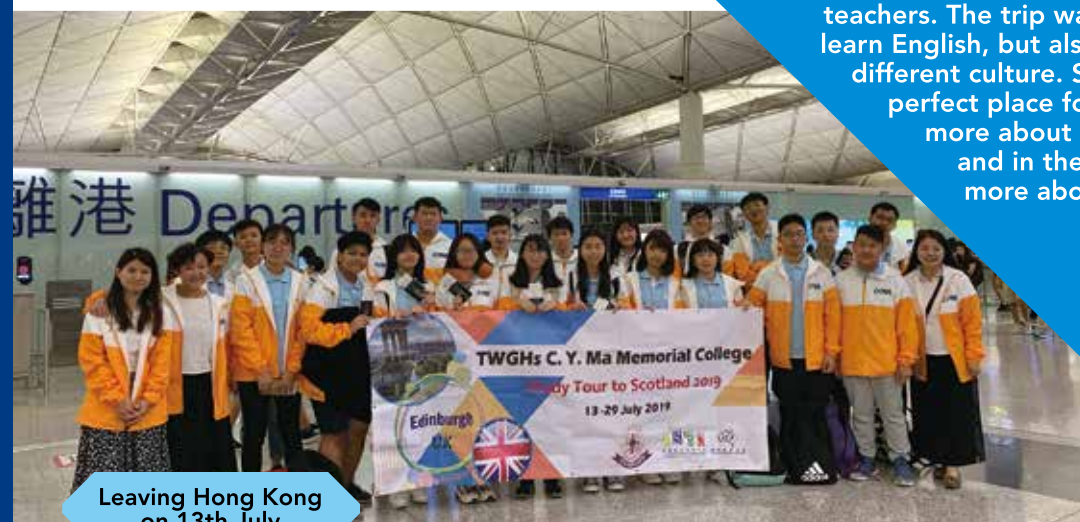

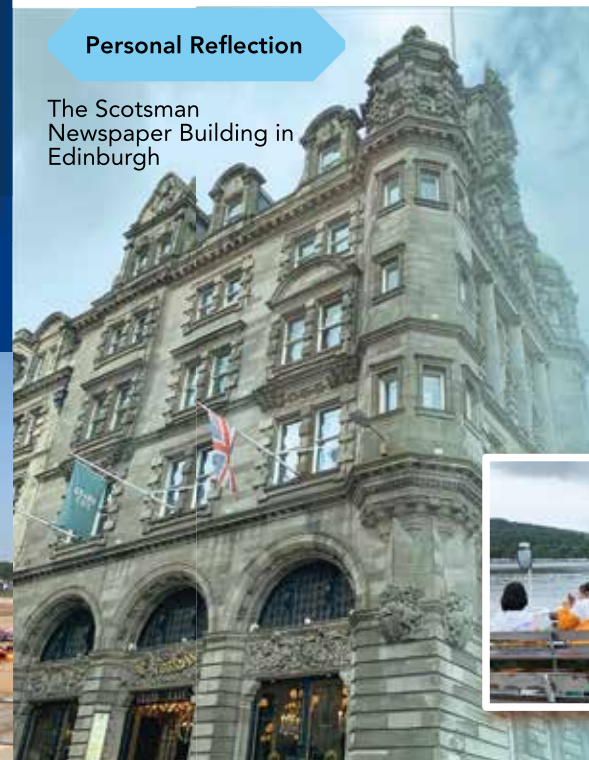

ENGLAND STUDY TOUR 2019

28 student ambassadors from all of Tung Wah's 18 secondary schools went on a visit to England in the autumn of 2019. The ambassador programme has been held for 5 years now, and since its launch has visited Los Angeles, London, San Francisco and Vancouver. The study tours explore the culture, education and economies of the places visited, as well as the historic relationship between these places and Chinese people.

Stonehenge is on the way to Bath from London. The wind was so strong there.

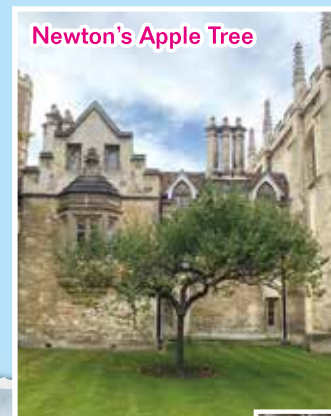


Windsor

Windsor is very close to London. We went on a half-day trip there and visited the castle. It is the main home of the British Royal Family. It is very beautiful.

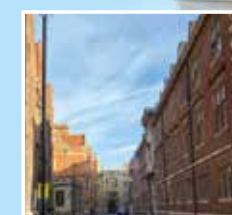

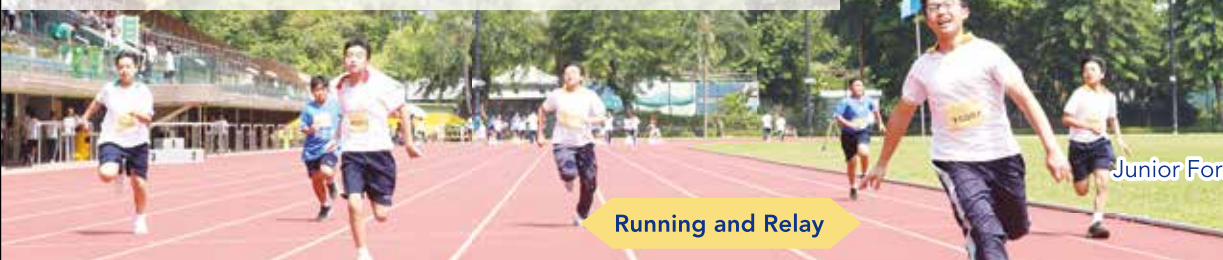

SPORTS DAY

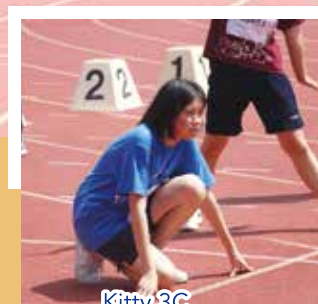

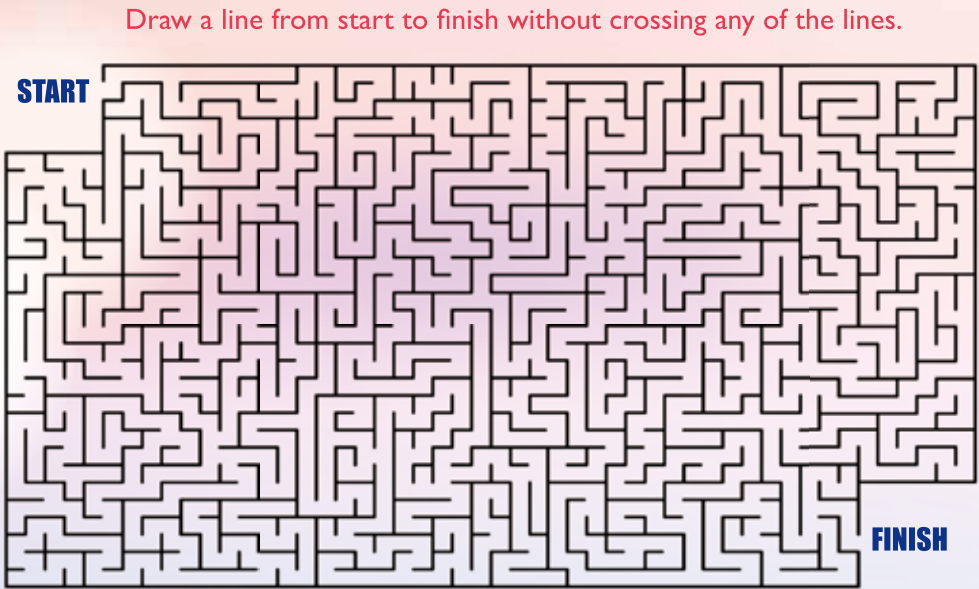
